Our Graduate

Kaitlin Nguyen, MD graduated from the Lewis Katz School of Medicine at Temple University on May 5, 2023. During her time in medical school, she was inducted into the Gold Humanism Honor Society for notable compassion, collaboration, and scientific excellence, as well as the national medical honor society, Alpha Omega Alpha. She was selected to receive the Susan and Robert Probst Prize for achievement in Surgery, the Society of Thoracic Surgeons Looking to the Future Scholarship, the Stabler Foundation Endowed Scholarship, and the St. Luke's Scholarship.

Dr. Nguyen was involved in multiple research projects in the fields of Cardiac, Plastic and Reconstructive, and Abdominal Organ Transplant Surgery. She published multiple first author manuscripts in peer reviewed journals and presented at local, regional, and national scientific meetings. Her work was highlighted as a featured article in the January 2022 Journal of Surgical Research and awarded the First Place Award in The 2021 Pennsylvania Medical Society Poster Contest.

She was involved in community outreach and mentoring programs, such as Lehigh Valley Big Brother Big Sister, Alumni Mentoring at Lafayette College, the Thoracic Surgery Medical Student Association Networking and Outreach Committee, and the Executive Boards of the Medical School Arts Groups and Surgery Interest groups.

In July, she will begin her surgical residency training at St. Luke's University Health Network in Bethlehem, PA, the hospital in which she was born twenty-six years ago. She plans to pursue a career in Cardiothoracic Surgery. She would like to thank her family, friends, and community for their support throughout the years.
