Dear Bethany Family,



Thank you for your hospitality during the past several months. I have enjoyed preaching and sharing in worship with you. I will conclude my time with you on April 14. I want to share an observation with you. Since I am "new" to Bethany, I look at things with "new" eyes. So, I may see things that many of you no longer notice. It appears to me that so much of Bethany's life is oriented to the past, with very little

pointed to the future. A symbol of that perspective is represented by the "stuff" that fills the Bethany building. You have an encyclopedia published before the moon landing. You have a set of Bible Commentaries from before the discovery of the Dead Sea Scrolls, a find that substantially shifted Bible understanding and interpretation. There were closets stuffed full of financial records—receipts, cancelled checks, offering envelope lists—from the 1980s, 90s, and 2000s. I found old wedding information sheets, monthly financial reports, and all sorts of committee meeting minutes that were 20 years old. People hold onto old things as a reminder of special times—ticket stubs from a first date. a child's first report card, a lock of baby's hair. They mark a date or an event that is unique and memorable. Bethany (and many other churches) accumulates "stuff" because you can. You can pile closets, cabinets, and even entire rooms with things that haven't been used in decades. Vital, growing congregations continue to "weed" what is stored because the space is needed for all the new events and new groups that are occurring. A year ago, at a meeting of Bethany leaders, I was told that Bethany needed to do more to grow and survive. It seems to me that would be difficult when you are surrounded by so much that is focused on the past.



Easter came early this year. As a church musician, as soon as Christmas is over and the New Year begins, the calendar gets flipped through to see the date that Easter "falls on". It's a habit...that planning ahead thing! One piece of music that I don't need time to think about is the opening hymn on Easter Sunday morning. Every year we begin our congregational singing with "Christ the Lord is Risen Today". It is a magnificent affirmation that our Lord defeated death, and has opened paradise for all believers. ALLELUIA!!! It's that one word that even the smallest child can sing with exuberance. Did you know that the meaning of Alleluia is Hallelujah, and Hallelujah means 10,000 praises to God? It is the highest praise that we can give, and a great way to express our profound joy. It is the highest praise that we can give for the best gift ever given...the gift of our salvation.

Thank you, Bethany congregation, for always making that hymn a truly joyous moment on Easter Sunday...congregational singing at its best! I also want to thank our Chancel and Handbell choirs, as well as Bethany's talented musicians, for making our Lenten season, Holy Week, and Easter services especially meaningful. Your time and dedication is always appreciated by all.
